The presenters include chiropractors Dr. Carlo Rinaudo, Dr. Anthony Nicholson and Dr. Aron Downie, neurotologist A/Prof. Phillip Cremer, psychologist Dr. Elyce Greenaway and pharmacist Casey Barton. Dr. Carlo Rinaudo PhD BMedSci (Hons) MChiro ICSSD DACNB, is a member of the Class of 2000 and is the only chiropractor with a PhD in Vestibular Rehabilitation at (UNSW) and Neuroscience Research Australia, and his area of interest is Chiropractic Neuro-Rehabilitation. He is the clinic director and founder of Brain Hub, and is currently involved in further research in vestibular neuro-rehabilitation. Dr Rinaudo frequently presents and teaches practitioners across the world on similar topics.



Dr. Anthony Nicholson is a member of the Class of 1997 and an adjunct lecturer in neuromusculoskeletal diagnosis at Macquarie. As an experienced and evidence-based clinician, Anthony regularly works via medical and specialist referral for chronic conditions. Anthony has completed in both clinical neurology and orthopaedics to become a Diplomate of the International Academy of Neuromusculoskeletal Medicine (DIANM), and also a Diplomate of the American Chiropractic Neurology Board (DACNB) - one of few chiropractors worldwide to be board certified in both disciplines. He is the CEO of Clinical Development International (CDI), a continuing education organisation Anthony has developed over 300 hours of advanced online clinical training that is used for post-doctoral neuromusculoskeletal medicine training program for chiropractors.

Dr. Aron Downie is a member of the Class of 1994 and continues in clinical practice. He is a health researcher and senior lecturer at Macquarie University Department of Chiropractic. He completed his PhD at the University of Sydney Medical School. Aron's research interests are recovery from spinal pain and the early detection of pathology masquerading as back pain. Aron instructs students in risk management strategies related to cervical spine manipulation, and is highly regarded by his students and peers.



A/Prof. Phillip Cremer is a Neurologist and is a Clinical Associate Professor at the University of Sydney. He has been awarded 2 research degrees in vertigo and a PhD. Dr Cremer has completed a Fellowship in vertigo (clinical & research) in the ENT Department at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore USA. He has a great interest in inner ear research, as well as treating patients with dizziness & vertigo. Dr Cremer has given over 100 scientific presentations in the area of vertigo & vestibular neurophysiology and remains actively involved in vertigo research, as well as with Neuroscience Research Australia in Sydney).

Elyce Greenaway works with adults and adolescents in the assessment and treatment of vertigo, anxiety, depression, trauma, adjustment disorder, anger, grief, and loss. She has an interest in women's health and is qualified to provide perinatal support counselling. Elyce has a decade of experience and an excellent knowledge of chronic pain and management of psychological workplace injuries. Elyce utilises cognitive behavioural therapy, acceptance and commitment therapy, mindfulness, and skills training. Elyce also applies solution focused brief therapy strategies for EAP.



Casey Barton is a Newcastle based clinical pharmacist with over 10 years experience in providing medication advice to members of the public. He has been involved with the provision of Home Medication Reviews to patients with complex medication and health needs. Casey a Senior Pharmaceutical Officer of the NSW Health Pharmaceutical Regulatory Unit where he provides advice and issues drug authorities under the NSW Poisons and Therapeutic Goods legislation. He is well placed to discuss medications that are used to treat dizziness, medications that cause dizziness and drug interactions.
